A Week-Long Summer Camp Experience For Grades 1-12 in the fall of 2025

Wanake Adventures is the classic “build-your-own-adventure” style camping.

Each group plans elements of their week, creating and enjoying a unique camping experience.

Activities for all groups include swimming, building campfires, Bible study, arts & crafts, games, worship, hiking, ice cream breakfast, cooking out, singing, 9-Square, and GaGa Ball, with opportunities to choose visiting the Wanake Farm, polar bear swim, and the waterslide.

Grades 1-3 follow a pre-planned schedule which includes the opportunity to try traditional camp activities, like visiting the Frog Pond and making homemade ice cream!

Grades 4-6 follow a partially pre-planned schedule which includes the activities listed above and a choice of rock climbing or canoeing.

Grades 6-8 choose one or two additional activities from the Jr High Adventure activity list: Rock Climbing, Star Gazing/Telescope, Night Hike, Canoeing, Sleepout, Challenge Course.

Grades 9-12 choose activities from the Sr High Adventure activity list: Waterfall Hike, Canoeing, Challenge Course, Rock Climbing, Canoe Swamping, Service Project.

Campers of all ages are challenged to build skills and grow in age-appropriate ways. Campers practice:

- decision making,
- friendship building,
- outdoor living,
- taking responsibility for themselves,
- leading,
- living as disciples of Christ, and more.

As campers become tweens, teens and young adults, they are progressively challenged to develop their skills further, have opportunities to try more challenging activities, and take more leadership of their group for a super fun week!

Cabins and Retreat Centers

Cabins

Wanake's traditional summer camp cabins feature bunkbeds, space for camper belongings, and a private changing area.

The cabins offer the traditional camping experience with the modern conveniences of electricity and ventilation.

Campers living in cabins walk to the nearby wash house or

shower house for sinks, toilets, and showers. Three of the cabins are air conditioned, a good choice for campers with asthma.

The Rock Lodge and The Survival Cabin

The Rock Lodge



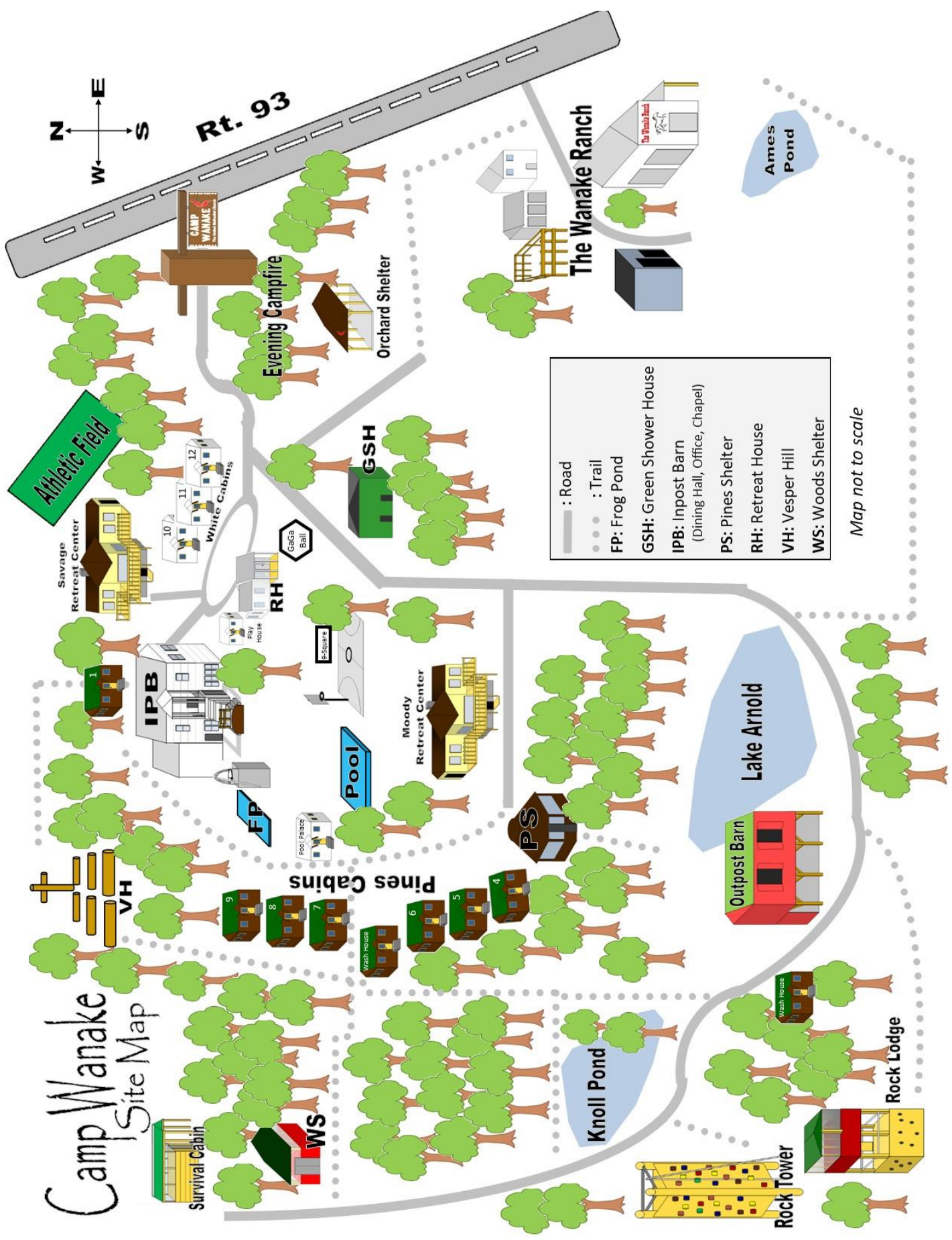
How cool would it be to sleep in a hammock-style bed, in a tree fort, in the woods? The Rock Lodge features a bouldering wall that campers climb up into the structure from ground level. (Bouldering is rock climbing horizontally rather than vertically). The second floor is a picnic shelter, which makes for a great place to do activities, out of the sun/rain. Campers climb into their bedrooms up a built-in ladder through a trap door. Hammock style beds hang from the ceiling of the structure as campers enjoy sleeping in the treetops. The top floor is completely enclosed for safety and security. Enjoy the rustic atmosphere while sleeping in the stratosphere 30 feet off the ground. There is fresh drinkable water on site, no electricity, and the nearest bathroom is a commercial portable toilet around the corner from the living space. Campers shower in the main camp. The Rock Lodge is sure to be one of the coolest places you have ever slept.

Survival Cabin

As the legend goes...a plane crash landed in the back woods of Wanake. No one was hurt. The passengers got out, and before night fell, they constructed a shelter- the Survival Cabin. They had a great night's sleep, woke up the next morning to the sound of campers hiking over the hill, and were saved. In gratitude, they gifted Wanake their cabin & plane. Of course, this is a legend! This completely enclosed cabin has a canvas roof and the rustic feel of a cabin constructed by crash survivors. The Survival Cabin offers an authentic survivalist experience with no electricity in a secluded environment. It is located near the composting toilet and the hand washing (tooth brushing - face washing) station. Campers shower in the main camp.

Important Information about Wanake Summer Camp

Who Will Care for My Camper?

Staff members, paid and volunteer, are carefully screened, selected, trained, and supervised by a year-round staff with 50+ combined years of camp experience. The staff is comprised of adults of all ages, including college students & high school graduates.

How does spiritual formation and Bible study work at camp?

Wanake's study of the Bible revolves around an experience-based interaction with the Word of God, worship, prayer, and a community based on God's unconditional love. In exploring God's Word, campers will be challenged to learn how to pray for themselves and others, see the work of the spirit in themselves and others, participate in small group worship, and be an agent of God's unconditional love. Wanake's goal is that each camper builds a relationship with God as they experience a community of unconditional love that points to God.

How is health care handled at Wanake?

Health care is provided through the health director who lives on site and a Registered Nurse who visits daily. All staff members have training in their healthcare responsibilities and follow the Camp Doctor's standing orders for minor illness & injury, including first aid and over-the-counter medications.

All medications are kept locked in the Health Center or a medical lock box and are monitored by staff. The Health Director monitors campers to make sure medications are taken as prescribed and that healthcare needs are met.

Medical, Behavioral, Dietary, and Social/Emotional Needs

Wanake's goal is to provide an excellent experience for each and every camper. We are best able to meet this goal when we are able to plan in advance and partner with parents. Please follow the following steps:

Before registering - Call Wanake.

Wanake is able to accommodate special medical, behavioral, dietary, and social/emotional needs for which the camper is able to provide some self-care and self-regulation with a pre-arranged plan. For summer 2025, Wanake may be able to provide one-on-one buddies for campers with special needs. Please contact Wanake before enrolling to review your camper's needs at 330-756-2333 or info@campwanake.org.

After Registering

#1 Notify Wanake

Once you have registered your camper, notify Wanake. This will give Wanake staff and your family time to plan and prepare together for an excellent experience.

#2 Medication and/or Behavioral Plans

If a camper is on medication or follows a behavioral plan during the school year, Wanake recommends that the camper continue the same medication or behavioral routine while at camp. Part of the fun of camp is adapting to a new environment and a new daily routine. Since campers' experience so many changes it is generally not a good idea to alter normal medication or behavioral routines during a stay at camp. Wanake asks that campers on psychotropic medication who have had a change in medication or dosage within three months prior to their arrival at camp notify Wanake.

What will my child eat at Wanake?

The Wanake Kitchen serves healthy, kid-friendly food and provides opportunities for campers to exercise decision-making in their food choices.

Wanake serves a variety of fresh fruits and vegetables – yogurt, granola, and fresh fruit with hot entrees at breakfast, salad with lunch, and fresh fruits and vegetables at supper and on cookouts. Many foods are cooked from scratch and desserts are baked homemade, reducing the use of high fructose corn syrup, artificial sweeteners, artificial colors/dyes, and hydrogenated oils. Finally, Wanake provides plenty of food for active campers engaged in energetic camp activities. With a pre-arranged plan Wanake can provide a balanced diet for those with food allergies and/or special diets: gluten-free, vegetarian/vegan, lactose intolerant, etc.
